Of Auckland, on Sunday 27th March 1921.

I respectfully report that A. Barras of Auckland, who is said top be formerly of Wellington, addressed a meeting at the Socialist Hall Manners St" on Sunday evening 27th inst".

The subject was "A message from the Third International, Moscow, to the workers of New Zealand".

John Loughran, tailor, was chairman, and gave a short address on the subject to be spoken of by Barras.

Barras in opening, said that this was the first Communist meeting held here, and he felt honoured to be the bearer of a message from the Third International.

After various preliminaries, he then proceeded in the following strain:-

"The Labour Party has developed into opportunists, and are of little use to the Communist Party.

The Socialist Party sit around tables and read and think a lot, but they do very little else to advance the Cause, of the Communist Party.

Compared to the Labour Party, the I.W.W. was revolutionary, but compared to the Communist, he is reactionary.

No one should be allowed to become a member of the Communist Party until he has proved by study and knowledge that he is educated up to the necessary standard. He should at least have studied the three editions of Marx.

The Communists believed that Parliament should be used to further their Cause. If a member was elected to Parliament he would not be responsible to his constituents only, but to the Communist Party, and he would have to do as he was instructed by the Communist executive, or if he did not he would be at
