**I. Meldevorgang.**

**Ab-meldung:**

- Der Pg. hat vor seinem Wohnungswechsel auf dem parteiamtlichen gelben Ummeldungsformular die für ihn bestimmten Einträge zu tätigen. Eine Durchschrift auf dem gleichbedruckten roten Formular wird dadurch hergestellt und dient der abmeldenden Ortsgruppe bzw. Stützpunkt als Kontrolle.
- Das vom Pg. ausgefüllte gelbe Ummeldungsformular ist von der Dienststelle in der Spalte Ab-meldung auszufüllen und zu stempeln.
- Die abtrennbare Ab- und An-meldungsbescheinigung wird ebenfalls durch die Ortsgruppe in der Spalte Ab-meldung gestempelt und ausgefüllt.
- Der abtrennbare Abschnitt wird sodann dem Pg. ausgehändigt.
- Das Ummeldungsformular (ohne Abschnitt) ist von der abmeldenden Ortsgruppe an die für sie zuständige Gauleitung, geschlossen mit den monatlichen Mitgliederstandsmeldungen, zu senden. Dort sind die Ummeldungsformulare zu Kontrollzwecken (die Namen der umgemeldeten Pgg. alphabetisch geordnet) zu registrieren.
- Gleichzeitig ist in das Mitgliedsbuch durch die Ortsgruppe bzw. Stützpunkt ein Überweisungsvermerk einzutragen.

**An-meldung:**

- Der Pg. hat sich bei seiner neuen zuständigen Ortsgruppe nach erfolgtem Wohnungswechsel sofort anzumelden. Er hat hierbei die ihm von der alten Ortsgruppe ausgehändigte und bestätigte Abmeldungsbescheinigung zugleich mit dem Mitgliedsausweis bzw. dem Parteibuch vorzulegen.
- Der Ortsgruppen- bzw. Stützpunktleiter kann den Pg. im Mitgliedsgrundbuch bzw. in der Mitgliederkartei erst dann in Zugang bringen, wenn ihm durch den Pg. die in der Spalte Ab-meldung ordnungsgemäß bestätigte Ab- und Anmeldungsbescheinigung, sowie der Mitgliedsausweis vorgelegt werden.
- Der Pg. erhält bei ordnungsgemäßer An-meldung die Ab- und Anmeldungsbescheinigung in der Spalte An-meldung ausgefüllt und gestempelt zurück. Der Pg. hat die in beiden Spalten bestätigte Ab- und An-meldungsbescheinigung sorgfältig aufzubewahren.
- Gleichzeitig ist bei Vorlage des Mitgliedsbuches durch die Ortsgruppe bzw. Stützpunkt der Anmeldevermerk in das Mitgliedsbuch einzutragen. Bei Mitgliedsarteninhabern ist die Mitgliedsartei unter Verbrauch des Dienststempels durch die Ortsgruppe bzw. Stützpunkt richtigzustellen.

**II. 2. Ausführungsbestimmung**

über die Verordnung zur Durchführung des Gesetzes zur Sicherung der Einheit von Partei und Staat vom 29. 4. 1935 (RGBl. I, 5. 586).

Auf Grund des § 8 Abs. 1 Satz 2 der Verordnung vom 29. März 1935 zur Durchführung des Gesetzes zur Sicherung der Einheit von Partei und Staat (Reichsgesetzbl. I S. 502) bestimme ich:

- Die Mitglieder der Nationalsozialistischen Deutschen Arbeiterpartei sind verpflichtet, alle, auch zeitlich beschränkte Wohnungs- und Personenstandsänderungen ihrer zuständigen politischen Dienststelle zu melden.
- Die Meldung der Wohnungs- oder Personenstandsänderung hat innerhalb drei Tagen zu erfolgen.
1. Die Wohnungs- oder Personenstandsänderung ist schriftlich bei der zuständigen Ortsgruppe oder dem zuständigen Stützpunkt anzumelden.  
 2. Die Meldung kann dem zuständigen Zellen- oder Blockleiter gegen schriftliche Bescheinigung übergeben werden.  
 3. Das Mitglied kann einen schriftlich Bevollmächtigten zur Vornahme der Meldung beauftragen.
- Bei allen Meldungen der Parteigenossen ist die Mitgliedsartei oder das Mitgliedsbuch in Vorlage zu bringen.
- Parteigenossen, die keinen dauernden Wohnsitz haben, müssen bei ihrer zuletzt zuständigen Ortsgruppe oder ihrem zuletzt zuständigen Stützpunkt ihren Verpflichtungen als Mitglied der NSDAP nachkommen.
- Zwiderhandlungen gegen diese Bestimmungen werden als schwere Verstöße gegen die Interessen der Partei durch die zuständigen Parteigerichte geahndet.
1. Diese zweite Ausführungsbestimmung zur Verordnung vom 29. März 1935 tritt an die Stelle der bisherigen Dritten Ausführungsbestimmung vom 1. Oktober 1934 (Verordnungsbl. d. Reichstg. d. NSDAP, Folge 82 S. 199) zur Verordnung vom 23. März 1934 (Verordnungsbl. d. Reichstg. d. NSDAP, Folge 68 S. 150).  
 2. Sie tritt mit Wirkung vom 10. April 1935 in Kraft.

On the 27th June, 1938 Karl Jakob Regner arrived in this Dominion at Auckland from Sydney as a passenger on the "Mariposa", and was arrested on a Provisional Warrant on a charge of theft at Sydney, N.S.W. He is at present on bail at Auckland pending extradition proceedings.


Among personal papers in Regner's possession when he was arrested and which were returned to him when he was released on bail was a certificate issued to him at Sydney on 18th June, 1938 as a member of the Auslands Organisation. A photographic copy of each side of the certificate was secured unknown to Regner, and I enclose one copy of each for your information.

Regner is about twenty-five years of age, born at Spital, Austria, his father being a hotel-keeper in that town.

From other papers in Regner's possession it appears that since leaving Austria seven years ago Regner has visited Spain, Balearic Islands, South Africa, Venezuela and Australia, in each of which countries he has followed his calling as a waiter.

He has not previously come under notice here.

REPORT of Detective E.A.Stevenson, No. 2627

relative to the attached photographs of membership form  
of the Auslands Organisation (members of Nazi Party in  
foreign countries).

I respectfully report that on 27/6/38 a young man named Karl Yakob Regner was arrested on board the "Mariposa" at Auckland, en route from Sydney to San Francisco.. He was arrested on a Provisional Warrant on a charge of theft at Sydney, N.S.W.

He was later released on bail pending the arrival from Sydney of a police officer to escort him back.

On the 1 st inst I made an examination of Regner's personal papers, before they were subsequently returned to him later the same day.

These showed that Regner is about 25 years of age, born in Spital, Austria, the son of a hotel-keeper there.. They also showed that Regner has travelled extensively since he was 18 years and that he has visited and worked in several countries, including Spain, Balearic Islands, South Africa, Venezuela, Australia and other places...

The papers showed that he was mainly employed as a head waiter and salesman and that he commenced his career with a course of instruction at a school for head waiters in Austria.

Many of the papers were in either the German or Spanish language. I obtained assistance with the translation of these papers.. All but one of them were of no importance or significance from the point of view of the Department. Most of them were characters and references from various hotels.

The one exception was a single sheet of paper, canary yellow in colour, size about 9 1/2 inches by 4 1/2 inches, with the left edge perforated, showing that it had been torn from a book.

It was headed with the words 'Auslands Organisation', it also bore the rubber stamp of the Nationalsoz Deutsche Arbeiterpartei - Stutzpunkt Sydney.

This signified to me that it was probably of considerable importance. I therefore had it photographed by police photographer Const.V.Naylor. No pin marks were made in the paper and when it was later returned to Regner with his other papers and wallet he would have no idea at all that the police had any interest in the paper.

I later handed photographs of the front and back of the paper to my informant in the German Club and he made an interpretation which I have typed - two copies are attached hereto... I also attach two copies each of the front and back of the paper.

It will be noticed that some of the wording of the rules (on back of paper) seems to be

rather clumsily phrased, but the difficulties of an exact literal translation of German are considerable.

However, I am assured that the correct text of the wording is given in the translation.

It is perhaps unnecessary for me to comment on the importance of this photographic evidence of this document.

It will be seen that it is issued from Munich, Germany - the headquarters of the Nazi Party.

It gives the signature of the leader of the Nazi group (or Stutzpunkt) in Sydney.

It is most probable that all members of the Nazi Party in foreign countries, including New Zealand, have a similar certificate in their possession.

The rules seem to be merely machinery or procedure rules, not the actual objective rules of the Nazi movement.

To be carefully preserved by the P G.

1. Reporting procedure.

Advice of leaving:

- (1) The P G (Party Comrade) must before his change of address on the yellow Party form make the entries necessary. A copy on the Red form will thus be made at the same time and serves the Place Group, Support Point and Control.
2. The yellow form filled out by the P.G leaving is to be filled in by the service place in the space therefore and stamped.
3. The perforated leaving and joining certificates will also through the Place Group be filled out and stamped in their section.
4. The detachable part will then be handed out to the P.G.
5. The certificate of change (without cut or portion) is to be sent from the Place Group being left to the District Leader, enclosed with the membership position. There the names of the changing P.G s are to be alphabetically registered.
6. At the same time and entry of transfer is to be made in the Place Group and Support Points.

Signing on :

7. The P.G must report to his new Place Group at once. He must present his leaving certificate from his old group also his membership card.
8. The Place Group and Support Point Leader can only enter the P.G P.G in the member's book and the member's card if a leaving certificate and proof of membership have been produced to him.
9. The P.G receives back when joining the new group, if the certificate is in order, the spaces on the leaving and rejoining certificate for rejoining stamped.
10. The P.G must carefully preserve both spaces on the form.

2. Instructions to be carried into effect.

Over the method of carrying out for the ensuring of the unanimity of the Party and State (State Laws page 1-502) I instruct  
It is the duty of all

1. The members of the National Socialist Workers Party, even of temporary addresses and alterations in personal position to immediately notify their political service branch.
2. The notice of change of address or position is to be made within 3 days.
- 3.1 The change of address or position is to be made in writing to the correct Place Group or Support Point.
  - 2 The advice can be given to those responsible by signs or block letters if certified.
  - 3 The member can give a written Power of Attorney to the Christian name of the advice.
4. By all advices of the Party Comrade. The membership card or book must be produced.
5. Party Comrades who have no permanent dwelling must (at)? their last Place Group or Support Point carry out their duties as members of the NSDAP.
6. Any action against these rules will be considered as a strong action against the interests of the Party.
- 7.1 This second definition of rules for the promotion of order, of the 29 th March 1935 took ~~place~~ the place of the up to now third definition of rules of the 1 st of October 1934.
  - 2 They came into operation on the 10 th April 1935.
