Dear Madam,

The Committee has considered the resignations attributable to the discrimination against Jews in Germany, and desire to make the following statement thereon:-

1. The first resignations followed on the publication of a letter by the German Consul.
2. This letter was written by him in his capacity as Consul of Germany in New Zealand.
3. The letter was not intended to be, nor is it, an expression of the Club's attitude on the question.
4. The Club is strictly non-political, non-sectarian, and non-military in its aims and objects, and on this account the question which is agitating the members who have resigned is one that, according to the Statutes of the Club, may not be brought before it for consideration.

Therefore the Committee itself can do no more than express sympathy with the natural feelings of the resigning members, and it assures them that to the best of their belief not one member of the Club is otherwise than grieved at cruelties or injustices suffered by Jews anywhere.

Under such circumstances they hope that these members will appreciate the cordiality of this attitude and consider resuming membership.
